RDA cataloguing standards focus on the user—helping them find, identify, select, and obtain materials (FISO). Do you want to ensure that your library operates efficiently and serves as a valuable resource for students, teachers, and school staff? Join this session to discover why cataloguing is essential! I'll cover the core elements of an RDA-compliant record, touch on MARC, and, most importantly, explain why cataloguing is the backbone of any functional school library. Topics will include ensuring easy access and organisation, saving time for users, promoting reading and learning, and effectively tracking inventory.
